Kansas Legal Services


The Kansas Legal Services which serve Marion County is located in Emporia. This office provides assistance with non-fee producing cases that affect individual's income, hous-

Medications and Sun



It is important to be more mindful and watchful of the medications during warmer months for a number of reasons. The reasons that everyone loves summer; the water, sun and heat are the exact same reasons that extra care must be taken when using medications. During the hot summer months, it is easy to become dehydrated. Dehydration is made worse when individuals decrease their fluid intake in an attempt to manage bathroom visits. Add in "water pills" or diuretics and the loss of fluid dehydration can be profound. Additionally, constipation is often caused by not consuming enough fluids and may be worsened during the summer months due to evapo-

ration of fluid from the skin. When certain medications are taken, exposure to the sun may also cause individuals to sunburn more easily. Reactions may occur with topical tetracycline and some sulfurbased products. Medications that are taken orally may also cause this response. A few well-known examples are amiodarone, sulfur compounds and tetracyclines, thiazide diuretics and some anti-diabetic agents. The heat may cause greater problems as we age. Older people may become more sensitive to any increase in the heat and may rapidly overheat. **Certain medications may** worsen this problem, causing individuals to be less likely to sweat and perspire, thus blocking their response to the heat and humidity. Medications such as haloperidol, thioridiazine and several others may cause individuals not to sweat. The release of heat is suppressed and individuals can overheat. While taking these medications, overheating may result in heat stroke. Use extra care to prevent becoming overheated from sun exposure, exercise and hot weather. For all above reasons, during the sunny months, it is extremely important to ask a healthcare provider about being out in the sun when starting any new medication or routine medications. How a person might react to a medication is often dependent on the dosage, the length of time in the sun and the sun exposure. Be mindful that these reactions can occur with any medication that is taken or applied.

Farmers Market Voucher Program

The Marion Co. Dept. on Aging is distributing Farmers' Market Vouchers again this summer. This program is available to individuals 60 years and older, live in Marion County and meet the Gross **Monthly Income Guidelines** as follows: household of one-\$1,815, household of

two-\$2,456, household of three-\$3.098 and a household of four-\$3,739. The vouchers are worth \$30.00. They can only be used at certified farmer booths which will display a sign of their participation. The vouchers can only be used on local grown fruits, vegetables, herbs and honey for

New Medicare numbers

President Obama signed a bill in April which will remove the Social Security number from your Medicare Card. This won't happen overnight. The plan is for the next four years new people applying for Medicare for the first time will be the first to have a different number. There are nearly five thousand people, who apply for Medicare every day. Then following those four years there will be four more years where they will change present card hold-

ers number. The cost will be \$320 million to pay for this change. So present card holders this won't begin until tentatively around the year 2020. The operational plans to implement the law have not been worked out. This law hopes to protect individuals from identity theft. The **Marion County Department** on Aging will make present cardholders aware when this process begins for them. You will receive no phone call from Medicare or Social Security in re-

gards to the changing of your number. These two agencies do all their correspondence by mail. Unfortunately when changes like this happen it opens the door up for scammers to try to take advantage of people.
