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



# My Medicare Account

The Medicare.gov website has changed since last year. The main change is you can do a search for your 2020 prescription drug plan through you're My Medicare Account. You can still do a basic or personalized search but you won't be able to save your drug list. The only way to keep your drug list is by having a My Medicare Account. The benefits of having a My Medicare Account is you can track your personal health information. view and print your

current prescription medications, take advantage of the Blue Button's useful features and access Medicare publications. You will need vour **Medicare card to** create your account. On the Medicare.gov website there is a box right under the picture which says "Create an Account". You will fill in your Medicare number, name, date of birth and other information that the online form requests. You don't have to have an email account to

register. You will also need to create a username and password, you might want to keep that information in a safe place. The My **Medicare Account** gives you a convenient way to manage and access both Medicare and **Health Information** online. If you have trouble accessing the My Medicare Account you can call for free technical assistance 24 hours a day, seven days a week (except on Federal holidays).

#### **IRS/Social Security Scams**

The Marion Co. Dept. on Aging has received phone calls in regards to people having received phone calls from the IRS or Social Security about their accounts. Remember these following guidelines. The **IRS/Social Security does** not notify people of issues by phone until it has sent written communications, usually multiple times. The SSA does contact some recipients by phone, but they're almost always because you have contacted them about a matter presently. A SSA/IRS employee will "never threaten you for information; they will not state that you face potential arrest or other legal action if you fail to provide information." "The agency states in such cases, the

call is fraudulent." So just hang up on the caller. Government agencies don't make idle threats such as saving they'll freeze your assets, revoke your driver's license or change your immigration status. If you have legitimately broken the law the government will follow due process. The IRS doesn't send out unsolicited emails or ask for detailed personal and financial information via email. The IRS/ Social Security don't accept payments via gift cardsperiod. Another scheme is a direct mail scam that primarily targets senior citizens. A letter comes in the mail offering an extra security check, along with a form asking for personal information and a filing fee. In the letter, the scammer asks

ey, and/or bank account information to help with the application. Again, this is a red flag, since the Social Security Administration will never ask for a full Social Security number, since it already know it.







# **Prescription Drug Enrollment**



Open enrollment is less than a month away. It runs October 15 through December 7. You should be receiving material from your present plan by the first of October which will tell you of any changes to their plan such as premium, deductible and medication tiers. Sometimes they will tell you if they are not covering a medication you are on. The deductible this year can be as high as \$435. During the donut hole or coverage gap you will pay

25% for brand name drugs and 36% for generics. The pharmacies in Peabody, Hillsboro and Marion will do comparisons for you if you purchase your medications from them. The Marion Co. Dept. on Aging will be glad to do your comparison and enroll you. Gavla will be at the Marion office during Open Enrollment except for these days she will be at the Hillsboro Sr. Center on Tuesday, October 22, Thursday, November 7 and Tuesday, November 26 from 8:15 a.m.
